Back on the home front owner Susan Chetri, five, from Neath, West Glamorgan was heartbroken when she heard her teddy had gone down be-hind enemy lines.

She had been promised £10 in sponsorship money for a local children's home, but could not collect it until she had Aberdeen and a certificate to prove he had made the

Everyone thought Aberdeen was a goner. But the tough teddy was showing the sort of survival skills that could change the SAS motto to Who Bears Wins.

His marathon yomp home ended when para-His marathon chute club chief instructor Dave Howerski made an off-target jump himself and landed almost on top of Aberdeen.


Dave, 39, said: "He was looking very bedraggled, but my daughter Amy took him in and washed him and nursed him back to health.

"We had really given hope after he slipped off a parachutist's belt and 20 of us couldn't find him anywhere.

"Now we're delighted to get him back as he was the first trainee we had ever lost."

Little Susan debriefed Aberdeen after his mis-sion and discovered the secret of his suvival.

"He said the rabbits found him and took care of him," she revealed.


